

TABOR FUND GRANT

Awards are intended to provide an opportunity for applicants to refresh and/or re-energize their spirituality, faith, mind and/or physical well-being, as part of fostering personal development and improving their ministry in the Diocese of Cleveland.

ELIGIBILITY

Parishes, schools or organizations and bona fide employees (paid or volunteer), lay, deacon or religious who work in a recognized ministry.

While deacons cannot receive monies for themselves from a Tabor Grant because they have a continuing fund stipulated by the Bishop, they can make use of the Tabor Grant for development of programs for groups or ministries with which they work.

March 15th September 15th

awarded on a semi-annual basis and funds education and formation initiatives, sabbaticals, and retreats for the spiritual growth and wellbeing of ministers.

NOTE: Tabor Event Calendar (TEC) awards are available throughout the year for local retreat centers or other retreat/wellness centers consistent with the moral and social teaching of the Catholic Church.

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT (CCHD)

THE LOCAL COMMUNITY GRANT

FOCUS: CCHD awards local grants to parishes and organizations that are working to empower people who are poor and low-income. The goal is to build better communities and alleviate poverty while promoting the values of Catholic Social Teaching. These groups work to change social structures and policies which undermine life and dignity, especially for the poor and powerless.

LOCAL YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT GRANT

FOCUS: CCHD encourages youth and young adult involvement in social justice and systemic change initiatives that support and promote the mission of CCHD. The objective of the Campaign is to give grants to projects that demonstrate both the intention and the capacity to effectively work toward the elimination of the root causes of poverty and to enact institutional change.

THE FR. DAVID FALLON AWARD

FOCUS AREA: Projects should be oriented towards Catholic Social Teaching, including but not limited to these principles: the empowerment of the poor, respect for human life and dignity, a preferential option for the poor, a call to participation, subsidiarity, solidarity, strengthening the family, and building community.

AFRICAN AMERICAN-NATIVE AMERICAN GRANT FROM THE COMMISSION FOR THE CATHOLIC MISSIONS AMONG THE AFRICAN AMERICAN AND NATIVE AMERICAN PEOPLE

FOCUS: Grant money is given for projects where the specific purpose is Catholic evangelization within the African American or Native American community; Projects must be initiated and carried out by the Catholic community: parishes, schools, offices, organizations; Preference will be given to those efforts which are collaborative; i.e., those that will benefit several parish communities, those which reflect parish/school cooperation, parish/diocesan office cooperation, parish/organization cooperation; Projects that are innovative and creative, as well as those which build on previous efforts are encouraged.
