FAMILY CENTERS: IMPACTING YOUR NEIGHBORS

Family Centers are neighborhood gathering places serving seniors, children and teens, families; those who are isolated, hungry, unemployed, or in need of emergency and medical services find help and hope through our children and family services.



4,946

Individuals are served at three Family Centers in Greater Cleveland.

Fatima Family Center serves Cleveland's Hough community by providing events, recreational and educational opportunities, and supportive services for youth, families, adults and seniors.



5 Learning Pods

Due to the pandemic, Fatima Family Center had to cancel their in-person programming but were able to offer five classrooms where students could come to daily for internet access to remote learning.

Twins Genice and GeNiah have participated in programs at Fatima Family Center since they were very young. Now, as their school has shifted to online classes, Fatima has shifted their services to provide the twins and their peers a safe, quiet place with fast internet to learn during the school day. Helpful staff members supervise five classrooms and offer assistance as students adapt to this new style of remote learning; and parents can be assured that their kids are receiving help.
